TOWN OF MANY April 1, 2020 Special Called Session

The Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Many met in special session via teleconference due to the COVID-19 outbreak, on Wednesday, April 1, 2020 at 10:30 AM which was conducted from Town Hall. Present were Mayor Ken Freeman, Town Clerk Amie Brown and HR Manager Karla Williams. Present by teleconference was Mayor Pro-Tem James Kennedy, Council Members Bobbie Jackson, Gay Corley, Anita Darwin and Mary Brocato.

Mayor Ken Freeman called the meeting to order and the prayer was offered by Alderman Kennedy.

Open to Public Comments relating to items on agenda: No one from the public was available

The purpose of the meeting:

- 1. Curfew: Mayor Freeman stated that he has ordered a curfew for all businesses and citizens from 8:00 PM until 6:00 AM and that staff is currently researching to see if he has the authority to also include merchants on state highways and if so they will also be included. (It was determined that Mayor Freeman does have this right since he declared a state of emergency). Mayor Freeman added that he advised the police department to not issue any tickets for a week and just give a reminder instead.
- 2. Resolution #2 of 2020 Public Gatherings: Alderman Kennedy made a motion to place a restriction on public gatherings to include churches until the threat of the Coronavirus is over. Mayor Freeman said this would also include theater, public meetings and bars. Alderwoman Brocato suggested that this include any face-to-face contact. Alderwoman Corley suggested until April 30th with the possibility of an extension. Passed with a motion by Kennedy; seconded by Darwin. Vote unanimous as each council member was called by name one at a time.

Next scheduled Regular Council Meeting is on Tuesday, May 19, 2020.

Motion to adjourn meeting at 10:50 AM was made by Alderwoman Corley and seconded by Alderwoman Brocato. Vote unanimous.
