5. Approve Minutes: March 17, 2026 Regular Session – Approved as written on motion by McLendon; seconded by Darwin; motion passed unanimously.

8. Guests: Courtney with AG's Office; Alisa Porter & Courtney Mounce; Caleb Burkett, Many Dixie Youth.

Departments: Koss provided iWorQ reports for Water, Sewer, Street, and Animal Control Departments

1. Water: Hydrants were flushed; repaired service line at Tobacco Warehouse meter; repaired leak on service line on Tract Street; 1" meter tap with 6" bore on Texas Highway for new fire station; stayed current with work orders and locates.
2. Sewer: Jetted lines on Buffalo with repairs to manhole; also jetted on Louisiana, McFarland, Georgia, Hwy 171, and Caledonia Streets; installed new pump at Walmart lift station; found and cleaned manhole off McFarland; placed root killer and degreaser in sewer lines where needed; cleaned and degreased Apollo lift station; installed sewer tap on Alieze St; camered line on Sabine Street with repairs made to 8" line; located manhole behind city hall; stayed current on work orders and locates.
3. Street: Replaced culverts on McClain Circle and Miller Street; new sidewalk on W. Georgia in front of church; Capitol Street sidewalk is completed; got handrails put up on Capitol St.; cleaned ditches on Ponder, Sorrell, Lawrence, Courthouse and 925 Louisiana; got new flowers planted; using Mower Max cutting ROWs and at the airport, ballparks, fairgrounds, MLK, Hilltop and Veterans Park.
4. Animal Control: Picked up 5 dogs and 5 cats; dog bite on Amazon delivery person at 1776 San Antonio Ave on 4-6-26.
5. Airport: Greer reported crews are mowing again; the donated "courtesy car" is being used now; the hangar project will hopefully break ground in a couple months.
6. Grants: Williams provided a written report for March 5 through April 16.
7. Chief's Report: Chief Wooley provided a report for March 2026.
